The Cornwall Air Ambulance is a vital emergency service for Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly, as a charity they rely on donations to fund their vital work.

Our school children will be walking, running, skipping or moving a combined total of 1144 miles, which is the amount of missions the helicopter completed last year.
